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At the Hermitage Medical Clinic Cardiology Department, we offer a wide range of procedures used to diagnose various cardiac complaints.

Our specialist non-invasive Cardiology Department uses state of the art equipment and best clinical practice to help our patients. We believe in a patient focused, high quality and efficient service.

We are located in suite 36 on the second floor.

Your Doctor has advised you to have some cardiac investigations performed. Below is an outline of our investigations and what to expect. If you require any further information please do not hesitate to contact us, we will be happy to assist in any way possible.

Our investigations

ECG (Electrocardiogram)

This test involves the placement of electrode stickers on specific areas on your chest and limbs. The electrodes are connected to an ECG machine via the leads and a tracing of your heart beat is printed. Through this test we can diagnose many rhythm disorders. Usually takes 10minutes.

Echocardiogram

This is an ultrasound of your heart. It allows us to assess the 'pump' of the heart, valves and blood flow patterns. Usually takes 30-40 mins

Exercise stress test

This involves being connected to an ECG and BP monitor and doing gentle exercise on a treadmill. Loose comfortable clothing and appropriate footwear should be worn eg. tracksuit and runners. It is important you **do not** come fasting. Please have something to eat no sooner than one hour before the test. Usually takes 30-45 mins.

Holter monitor

A holter monitor is a continuous recording of your ECG. It consists of wearing a small monitor with three electrodes attached to your chest. It may be worn for 24 or 48 hours depending on your Doctors request. You will need to return the next day to have the monitor removed. Usually takes 10-15 mins to fit monitor.

Blood pressure (BP) monitor

A BP monitor records your BP at set intervals over a 24hour period. It consists of wearing a small monitor worn around your waist or shoulder, which is connected to a cuff worn on your arm. Loose clothing is preferable for your comfort. It may be worn for 24hours. You will need to return the next day to have the monitor removed. Usually takes 10-15 mins to fit monitor.



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Event monitor

It is a heart rate monitor you wear for a week. It only records if you activate it when you experience symptoms. Usually takes 15-20mins to fit monitor.

Defibrillator (ICD) check

Pacemaker check

Loop recorder check

If you have a defibrillator, pacemaker or loop recorder inserted you will need to have regular checks to ensure the device is set up and working appropriately for you. It is also important to ensure there is sufficient battery life remaining in your device. We can also offer a service that remotely checks your device from your home.

Screening clinics

Heart Failure screen

Our heart failure screening programme involves having an ECG, blood test and heart questionnaire. The results are interpreted by the Cardiology Doctors, who send a comprehensive report and recommendations to your GP. You will also be given recommendations and educational booklets.

Cardiac Risk assessment

This programme assesses your risk of developing fatal cardiac disease. It involves having blood tests, ECG, BP and body measurements. The results are interpreted by our Cardiology.

A referral letter is required for all of our investigations. This can be obtained from your GP or Consultant.

Pricing and insurance

All fees are payable on the day.
