



Mr Feras Abu Saadeh, Consultant Gynaecology Oncology/ Pelvic Surgeon

Feras obtained his medical degree (MB ChB) in Sebha Medical University, Libya in 2000. He then completed 5 years of post graduate training in obstetrics and gynaecology in Maqased Hospital, Jerusalem, before arriving in Ireland in 2005.

Since 2006 he is a member of the Royal College of Obstetrician and Gynaecologist (UK), Royal College of Physician (Ireland) and member of the British Society of Colposcopy and Cervical Pathology (BSCCP). In 2008, he was appointed as lecturer at Cork University Maternity Hospital where he played a significant role in undergraduate teaching and was involved in the establishment and first year of operation of the first Robotic theatre in the country. Feras joined St. James's hospital in 2009 and was instrumental in transforming the gynaecology services from open traditional surgery to minimal access surgery.

His research was published in international peer reviewed journals. Feras has an MD from Trinity College Dublin and he is an RCOG accredited subspecialist in Gynaecology Oncology. Since 2013, he is working as a Consultant Gynaecological Oncologist at St. James's hospital, Dublin and is a senior clinical lecturer for Trinity College Dublin.

Specialities

- Ultra-radical cytoreductive surgery in advanced cancers to achieve no visible tumour following the procedure
